TAXONOMIC UNIQUENESS:

DESCRIPTION: Biennial or short-lived perennial 5.0-8.0 dm (10.0-32.0 in.) high, mostly branched throughout sometimes with one or more accessory stems from base: pubescence hirsute throughout, spreading, sparse: leaves abundant, crowded on slender peduncles (3.0-10.0 cm (1.25-4.0 in.) long, lower leaves 8.0-15.0 cm (3.25-6.0 in.) long including narrowly margined petioles, deeply pinnately lobed; rays numerous, 2-3 times as long as the bracts, violet-blue; disk flowers very numerous.
